Conference Information

The <u>Climate-U network</u> brings together universities from around the world committed to working together to address the climate crisis. The network was born out of the Climate-U project (Transforming Universities for a Changing Climate) which ran from February 2020 - January 2024, funded by the Global Challenges Research Fund.

The aim of the network is to strengthen climate action and sustainability efforts within each institution and collaboratively given that the sustainability challenges traverse sectors and regions. Universities are central to the transformation of societies, through their unique role in professional development, knowledge production and public debate. While there has been increasing attention to the active role universities can play in recent years, and many institutions have made commitments to achieving carbon neutrality and just transitions, there is still a significant knowledge gap.

Building on the <u>Higher Education and the Climate Crisis</u> event held in London in October 2023, this conference provides a space for debate, exchange of ideas and sharing of new research on diverse aspects of the higher education-climate crisis-sustainability axis. It offers a platform for a range of activities that will include interactive seminars, workshops, research papers and poster presentations featuring interdisciplinary perspectives from prominent speakers and decision-makers in climate education.

The mode of the conference will be blended with both in-person events to be held at the Kenyatta University Conference Centre, Nairobi, and virtual participation.

We welcome submissions for presentations from academics, practitioners, activists, early career researchers and students. The following types of submission are welcomed:

Individual paper

Empirical research or theoretical paper to be presented in parallel sessions

Symposium

Grouping of three or four paper presentations around a common theme

Workshop

Hands-on, participatory session led by a facilitator/s

Poster

Presentation of research in visual form inviting small group discussions

• Artistic engagement

Including poetry, music, visual arts and short films.

Submission requirements

All submissions should contain the following information:

- Names, affiliations and contact details of all authors
- Indicate which is the presenting author
- Indicate which of the sub-themes the presentation relates to (or the open strand)
- Indicate whether in-person or virtual

Individual paper

Abstract of 250 words

Symposium

overview of 200 words followed by title and 100 word summary of each of the constituent papers.

Workshop

overview of 250 words. The proposal should indicate the objectives of the workshop, target audience and expected number of participants.

Poster

Abstract of 150 words
